

# Supporting centrally managed Quaker work




## What does **Britain Yearly** Meeting do?






In 2023, income from trading and legacy income showed a strong recovery from 2022. Donations from Friends decreased from £2.4m in 2022 to £2mil in 2023.




### In 2023 BYM spent £10.8m on:

## The challenge & how you can help

- Inflationary pressures mean that it costs more for us to deliver the work Friends want us to do
- More of the centrally managed work of Friends will need to be sustained by direct support from Friends
- If each area meeting were to aim to increase their level of contributions to the next level (see previous slide), we would be better able to resource the centrally managed work
