Insurance campaigning has already helped to delay the East African Crude Oil Pipeline. This project has violated human rights and, if built, would be a massive source of carbon emissions.

The Quaker faith is rooted in a belief in the humanity and equality of all people. Quakers in Britain are therefore called to respond to human rights violations and the injustice of the climate crisis.

We support the Insure Our Future campaign by:

- **writing** open letters to insurance companies
- **organising** vigils at insurance company headquarters
- **supporting** people of faith to join the campaign and take action or raise awareness
- **sharing** information about the campaign.
